About AusNOG 2012

AusNOG 2012 is the 6th annual conference held by AusNOG, the Australian Network Operators Group. There are 2 primary aims of the event :

1. Provide technical content relevant to Australian Network Operators.
2. Provide an environment that encourages the personal and professional networking of the key personnel in the industry.

AusNOG conferences are limited to 200 attendees to ensure that the delegates have good access to the speakers and to encourage an informal atmosphere. AusNOG is the only event each year where the country's top network engineers can come together to learn from leaders of the industry and to discuss current operational issues with their peers.

AusNOG 2012 consists of 2 days of quality technical content presented by both local and international speakers. The event regularly attracts presenters who speak at IETF and NANOG meetings, giving the Australian community an opportunity to hear these speakers without costly international travel.

Included in the registration fee are morning tea, lunch, and afternoon tea on both days. A ticket to the Pipe Networks AusNOG Dinner is also included. The AusNOG Dinner, held on the evening of the first day of the event, is one of the key professional networking opportunities of the year.

AusNOG was founded in 2007 by 3 long term members of the Australian Internet industry who saw a need for members of the industry to communicate with each other and learn from each other. To this day, the AusNOG conference is organised and run by key members of the industry who volunteer their time to the event. By securing quality sponsors and using volunteer labour, the registration fee for AusNOG is a fraction of the normal commercial training or conference charges.
