Before






Crisis Lifecycle

Enhanced Cyber Security Obligations for systems of national significance

Under the Security Legislation Amendment (Critical Infrastructure) Bill 2020, after first consulting with the entity, the Minister for Home Affairs may privately declare an asset to be a system of national significance.

Entities responsible for assets designated as systems of national significance may be subject to **Enhanced Cyber Security Obligations**

These include:-

- Incident response plans (What to do and who to call)
- Cyber security exercises (may be discussion or tabletop-based, operational or functional)
- Vulnerability assessments (Paper based, Hands on or Automated scanning)
- Access to system information (Real time telemetry, periodic reporting, or after an event)



Crisis Simulation



- Involve the actual crisis management team
- Be relevant and plausible
- Give people a sporting chance
- Pressure test extant resources
- Be tailored for your organisation
- Use your lessons learned process

• Aviate, Navigate, Communicate, Administrate






PRE SCHOOL will now be subsidised for three-year olds in a Budget move by Treasurer Dominic Perrotter to help families samgding to meet childcare costs.

At least 6500 three year olds will access the preschool scheme, which


